Objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Improvement of the protection of refugees especially for women and children ● Improvement of water and sanitation environment in the host communities 		
Project Outline	<p>In this project, two activities will be implemented in the refugee camps and host communities.</p> <p>Firstly, in the Myanmar Refugee Camps 25 and 27 in Cox's Bazar, two Women Friendly Spaces (WFS) and two Child Friendly Spaces (CFS) will be operated. These facilities provide courses on protection risks, recreational activities for stress care, and psychosocial support by Psycho Social Counselors. Besides, based in 2 WFS facilities, the implementing NGO will provide information through outreach, conduct assessments to identify the need for support, and provide case management according to individual needs.</p> <p>Secondly, maintenance and management of WASH facilities, including monitoring and repairing of water sanitation facilities, and hygiene awareness sessions at schools will be operated in the host community in Teknaf.</p>
