

Priority targets of Emergency Response for People Fleeing Myanmar 2021

Strategic Objectives		
1	Promote equitable access to the support needed to ensure the quality and dignified livelihoods of displaced persons	The urgent humanitarian needs of the communities, which could further increase due to COVID-19, are met through assistance in various fields such as WASH, health, education, and protection, and fair access to quality and dignified livelihood is promoted regardless of the gender, age, disability of the displaced persons.
2	Providing assistance that benefits both displaced persons and host communities	In light of the ongoing tensions between displaced persons in camp and host communities in Cox's Bazar, JPF will provide assistance that directly or indirectly benefits humanitarian needs of both communities, taking account of the socioeconomic conditions of the region where is inherently vulnerable.
3	Contribute to strengthening the resilience of people and communities affected by humanitarian crises	Given the prolonged plight of the displaced persons, the assistance which contributes to capacity strengthening of the communities, such as education, skills training, awareness-raising activities, and human resource development, will be provided with the longer term perspective, and the foundation of the system will be created so that the displaced persons and communities can continue and develop their own activities.
4	Promote understanding and awareness of the rights of people who have gender related vulnerabilities	The need for protection of women and children is increasing due to prolonged evacuation, increased psychological stress caused by COVID-19, and security deterioration. In light of this situation, JPF will promote the understanding and awareness of the rights of vulnerable groups from a gender perspective by actively engaging them in the activities of each sector and conducting awareness-raising activities to promote the understanding of the people around them, while respecting the traditional values and cultures of displaced persons.
